Noun A noun is the name of a person, place, or thing. Person: Name, Title girl, adult, parent boy, house, school teacher, store, dog	Pronoun A pronoun is used instead of a noun in a sentence. A pronoun may take the place of the name of a person, place, or thing. I, you, he, she, it, we, they, us, her, his, me, him, her, us	Verb A verb is an action word or a word that says what someone or something is doing. A verb can also express a state of being. Action: Run, jump, swim, sing State of Being: am, are, was, were, is, are, was, were
